#### Introduction

The **Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt** (Katholische Universität Eichstätt-Ingolstadt, **KU**) is the **first and only Catholic university in the German-speaking world**. With about 5000 students, it is currently the smallest university in Bavaria. Being a small university, the KU provides an excellent environment for interdisciplinary exchange, made possible by eight faculties, about 120 professors, more than 300 research associates, and a large number of lecturers with practical experience.

### Identity

The Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt is a modern university with a long tradition. It has existed in its current form since 1980, but its roots go back to the year 1564 and the foundation of the Collegium Willibaldinum, the first priest seminary north of the Alps. The Ingolstadt School of Management (WFI) was added in 1989. Ingolstadt has an even longer tradition as a university town: Bavaria's first university was established there in 1472 with the Pope's approval.

The KU is a state-approved university that is supported by a Catholic foundation. The degrees and qualifications that the KU awards are equivalent to those issued by state universities in Germany. The KU welcomes students of all faiths and sees itself as an academic community that conveys knowledge and teaches social skills based on Christian values. Open dialogue and critical thinking are vital characteristics of the university's community and of the learning and teaching that take place here. The KU sees knowledge transfer as its third academic mission alongside research and education. Constructive discussion with society has an economic, cultural, social, political, and Christian dimension at the KU.

After registering, applicants will receive an e-mail containing their access code, enabling them to complete their data and download their Welcome Package. Afterward, they must upload the following documents:

- A print version of the online application signed by the student and confirmed (signed and stamped) by the home university
- Language proficiency form (if the language of instruction is German: B1 if the language of instruction is English: B2)
- Copy of passport (or ID)
- Passport photo
- Transcript of records
- Learning agreement/study program
- Housing application (highly recommended)

Visa / entry requirements	
<b>No visa required</b> to enter and study in Germany	Nationals of the <i>European Union and citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway,</i> and <i>Switzerland</i> do not need a visa.
	However, all students still need to register as a resident at their local registration office.
	<i>KU International Office Service in Eichstätt:</i> Students can register as residents in Eichstätt via the International Office. In addition to the completed forms, the International Office will need two copies of each student's ID card or passport.
	KU International Office Service in Ingolstadt: Buddies are available to assist with the registration process.
eAT required after arrival	All students still need to register as a resident at their local registration office.
	<ul> <li>In addition, nationals of <i>Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea, United States, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco,</i> and <i>San Marino</i> have to request the eAT (electronic residence permit) after arrival AND having registered at their local registration office.</li> <li>The required documents for requesting the eAT are: <ul> <li>Passport (must be valid for the entire duration of stay in Germany)</li> <li>Certificate of enrollment from the KU</li> <li>Proof of financial resources (blocked account) or scholarship confirmation</li> <li>Proof of health insurance (in German or English)</li> <li>Biometric passport photograph (we highly recommend having this photograph taken in Germany due to unique technical passport photograph specifications)</li> <li>Rental contract (all pages and signed by the student and the landlord/landlady)</li> <li>Resident registration confirmation</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Visa required prior to	Please visit the German Foreign Office website to find the
arrival	most up-to-date information about requesting a visa. There, students can also check whether they need to apply for a visa
AND	or not. If the visa is not valid for the entire duration of the study period
eAT required after arrival	in Germany, students will have to extend their visa by requesting the eAT.
